

#### We've come a long, long way together... And we're keeping going!

What's your vintage? I'm 1978, and the magazine is older than me! It began in the early 1970s, so may well be a grand 50+ years old by now. All that time ago, in amongst the flares and ABBA, the Revd. Michael Hill had the idea of creating a parish news- a joint venture between what was then three church denominations in the village. Much of the housing in and around Brook Road was still new- the village had grown quite quickly, and so it was an important moment to build a sense of community. The Methodist, Presbyterian and Anglican churches worked together to coordinate the local news and updates.

In those earliest days, entries were typed up onto stencils and then the copies were printed using a Gestetner machine (which was kept under the stairs in the secretary's house!). There were just 200 copies back then- our print-run now is over 800. Once printed, the (rather large) pile of pages was taken to the Methodist Church Hall to be



stapled together before distribution. As the years went by the magazine grew- more local businesses advertised in it for a small fee, and the print-run was outsourced to a printer in Hadnall. An annual coffee morning was held to raise funds so that the magazine could be delivered free to every home in the Parish.

A lot has changed since then! But we are so indebted to those faithful visionaries who began our magazine, and who made sure it was a gift to the community, rather than something that had to be paid for. Some of those original volunteers have passed away, but many are still with usand to all of them we say a big, heartfelt thank-you 22. They have given us a rich history and an amazing heritage.

What began in a cupboard under the stairs has certainly broadened its reach since then! But some things have remained the same. We have a dedicated team of volunteers who work hard every issue to make sure the whole process goes to plan. Even with the evolution of technology, there's no escaping the hard-graft that goes into putting all the pieces together and enabling the completed mag to soar through your letterbox.



And in our new-look magazine there is continuity and change. We recognise that village life looks quite different to how it did 50 years ago, and we want to reflect that in our content. We've also introduced a bit of colour... but actually, it's a step backwards! In fact, the magazine covers used to be in colour and changed month by month. The design that has been used in recent years, which shows the three churches in the village, was created by Helen Woodman.

Though the Presbyterian Chapel has now sadly closed, local churches are still united in their understanding of the importance of life together. There is a saying that there is no 'l' in 'Christian' (yes, I recognise there are two!)- the message being that we are never alone, and that is a key part of the Gospel we commend. We believe in God who is community, who calls us to live well together- not as isolated little islands, with no sense of place; but as people of *this* place- *this* community. We hope it is a place where people care for one another, where they know where to find help if they need it and where they feel that they belong. If the Bomere Heath and District News goes some way to giving that hope a helping hand, then our work is done!

A sample of our activities has included building birdboxes for the RSPB, a mud kitchen for a local school, providing hot meals and of course, restoring the noticeboard for Bomere Heath Village Hall.

#### Tales from the Vets By David Jagger R I P JOEY

Eight-year-old Peter was the devoted owner of Joey, a beautiful blue budgerigar. He had been given Joey as a 5<sup>th</sup> birthday present. Peter had begun to notice that Joey was gradually changing shape. His chest appeared to be becoming more prominent. Apart from this he seemed to be well and his usual chirpy self; eating his millet seed and chewing away on his cuttle fish.

Peter talked to his mum about Joey's chest swelling, which she had also noticed. This had also given her concerns but she had not wanted to worry Peter.

Eventually it was decided that Joey should be taken to the veterinary practice which looked after their aged spaniel.

Joey was transported in a small cardboard box with small holes punched into it so that he would not be short of air and he arrived at the practice for the morning surgery at nine o'clock. As he was the first to arrive Joey was called into the consulting room by a young nurse. The vet on duty was welcoming and chatted to Peter about Joey, telling Peter that although he treated all animals, he did have a particular interest in birds.

Joey did not seem at all bothered about being handled and allowed the vet to carry out a careful examination. Later, out of hearing of Peter and his mother the vet commented to the nurse that instead of this being a budgie with a growth this was more accurately a growth with a budgie attached to it! The vet explained to Peter and his mother that such growths were not uncommon in budgies and that the only course of action was surgical removal or putting to sleep. The risks of anaesthesia and surgery for small birds were discussed and Peter and his mother decided that Joey should have a chance.

After the other patients had been seen Joey was prepared for surgery and anaesthetized by allowing him to breath a mixture of Halothane (anaesthetic vapour) and oxygen. The operation which the vet had carried out on several previous occasions had gone without a hitch and blood loss had been minimal. The anaesthetic had been turned off and the vet was just starting to congratulate himself when Joey gave a small sigh and expired. Budgie CPR is difficult but maximum effort was used to try to revive him but with no success. Vet and nurse surveyed the little body with great sadness.

Everyone was aware of the risk but the thought of telling Peter was miserable.

At lunch time, without telling anyone, the young nurse disappeared down into town and returned half an hour later with a little cardboard box with holes in it. Before opening it, she explained to all that on the whole most blue budgies are pretty hard to tell apart and that could we not ring Peter's and say that Joey was ready to be collected. An in-depth ethical discussion ensued which did not prevent the call being made Peter and his mother arrived to pick up Joey Mark II. Expecting to see a delighted Peter the nurse notice that he looked unimpressed. Asked if he was pleased to get Joey back, he said: "Not really, I was sure he would die so I sold his cage".

Below are extracts from the Parish Council meeting at Bomere Village Hall on Wednesday 10<sup>th</sup> January 2024

#### Community News

#### Community Christmas Tree,

The Parish Council have been working on a Community Christmas Tree for some time and we were please to erect a Christmas Tree & Lights on the Shrewsbury Rd this Christmas. The fine specimen was kindly donated by Leaton Estate, we wish to thank the team at the Christmas Tree Farm for delivering the tree. Councillors decorate the tree with lights and we hope that you liked the festive addition to the Bomere Heath Village.

The intention is to make it an annual occurrence.

#### **Community Events**

The Parish Council intend to fund and aim to facilitate a community event committee to host a Fete in 2024 and are hoping that we can financially assist an event to commemorate the  $80^{th}$  Anniversary of the D Day Landings on the  $6^{th}$  June.

Should you wish to be involved, please contact the PC Clerk to register your interest. It is only with the support from the community that these events can be held.

#### Planning

We reviewed 1 application this period.

Full Feedback can be found on the Shropshire Planning Portal.

The PC has been requested to re-review the proposal for the Galliers Land to the south of the village and issue an updated set of comments

#### Finance –

The **precept** for 2024/25 was discussed and the PC unanimously agreed that due to cost pressures and the deficit between income and

expenditure that in 2024 there would be an increase to the Precept. (This is the allocation from the Council Tax) In recent years the PC has tried to minimise costs, but an expectation is that there will be an increase of 50p - £1 per household. This will generate an estimated £1200. This will be visible on the Council Tax Statement.

#### Youth Club

The Parish Council has continued to fund the youth club and the club is boasting a weekly participation of 20 - 25 children from over 50 children that is a vital asset to the younger children, however, the volunteer numbers to support the group and keep the club operating has dwindled forcing the club to close on 2 occasions in the last 8 weeks.

SYA (Shropshire Youth Association) are concerned that without the volunteer numbers, the group won't be sustainable, even with the funding support from the PC.

If you have the capacity to assist or are a parent/carer of children attending and could help out on a Thursday evening, this would be a valuable asset to the group and may be the difference between the club continuing and closing.



The next meeting is to be held on Wednesday 14<sup>th</sup> February 2024 – 7.30pm in Bomere Heath Village Hall.

#### News from last term

We had a very busy Autumn Term in school!

There were many exciting events and lessons and we are going to share them with you in the Parish Newsletter.

In our Art lessons in KS2 we all did weaving inspired by Annie Albers but in Wrekin Class, Years Five and Six, we made our weaving on a wood frame that we had to

KS2 got to watch and admire their hard work; we all enjoyed the performance! The whole school had a Christmas treat as we all got to see Jack and the Beanstalk panto at Theatre Severn!

We also had some sad news as our PE teacher Miss Ryan and our Teaching Assistant Mrs Norris have left. Many of us were sad, they will be missed and we wish them good luck in the future.




